► HEARTWORMS

PROTECT YOUR PET BY LEARNING MORE ABOUT HEARTWORMS AND HEARTWORM DISEASE:

- Heartworms are spread by mosquitoes. Weather events that bring more mosquitoes (heavy rains, flooding, hurricanes) increase the risk of heartworm infection.
- The presence of a heartworm positive dog in your neighborhood increases the chances your dog will be bitten by an infected mosquito.
- Heartworm proteins take at least five months to show up in a dog's blood stream after infection.
- Signs of heartworm disease include a mild persistent cough, reluctance to exercise, fatigue after moderate activity, decreased appetite, and weight loss. As the disease progresses, animals may develop heart failure and the appearance of a swollen belly due to excess fluid in the abdomen.
- Houston, with its rainy climate and many homeless animals, is a prime location for heartworm infections.

PREVENTION IS THE BEST OPTION!

- Give your pet monthly heartworm preventatives. Even dogs that spend most of their time indoors need monthly preventatives.
- Puppies can be started on a heartworm preventive as early as 8 weeks of age. Check product packaging for instructions and dosage.
- Other animals like cats and ferrets can also get infected; check with your vet for preventives.
- Treatment is available for dogs who get infected but it can be expensive, difficult for the dog, and may not work.
- Remember, prevention is always the best option!
